

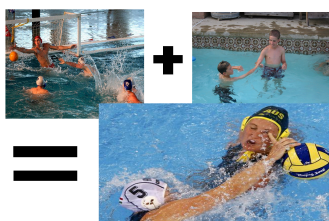

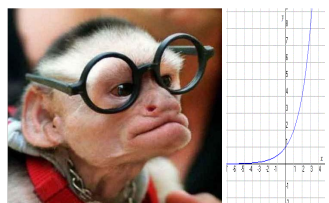

Apparently they don't make alarm clocks like they used to.

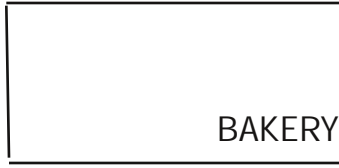
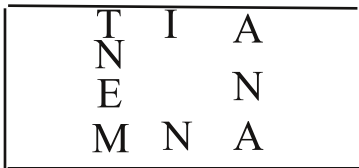

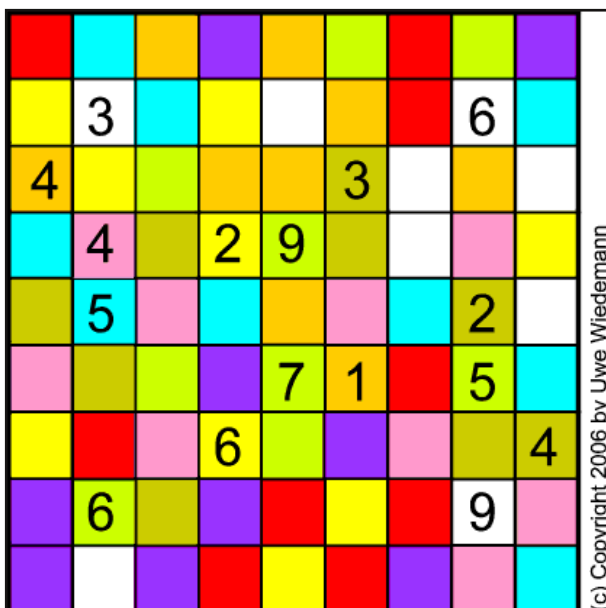
